1) Assessing Your Call to Servant Leadership (Allen Library) Participants will discover, develop and maximize their God-given spiritual gifts, both for ongoing personal growth and to provide leadership. Goals for each participant will be to understand the meaning of spiritual gifts, to identify personal gifts, to discover one's passion, and to learn about opportunities to lead and serve in both church and community.
