## Advocate for Fair and Free Elections as a Michigan Poll Worker

As was <u>recently reported</u> by The Michigan Conference of The United Methodist Church, Michigan United Methodists are urged to consider signing up to become election workers to fill the critical need in our state, as just one of several ways to live out our faith as United Methodists and advocate for fair and free elections.

Earlier in October, the Michigan Department of State contacted the Michigan Conference requesting that communities of faith assist in recruiting election workers to serve during the upcoming midterm elections on November 8. The election is coming up quickly and there is a significant shortage of volunteers. As noted by James Deaton, Content Editor for the Michigan Conference, "Engaging in the electoral process is a way United Methodists can put Christian faith into practice by ensuring all people have access to free and fair elections as a fundamental human right and a pillar of democracy. These beliefs are rooted in the Scriptures and our United Methodist Social Principles."

If you would like to apply to be an election worker, you must be a registered voter in the state of Michigan and complete the Democracy MVP Election Inspector interest form located on the Michigan Department of State Democracy MVP website at <u>https://www.michigan.gov/sos/Resources/Initiatives/democracy-mvp</u>. When filling out the form, please type "UMC" in the organization name field. For more information on volunteer qualifications, please visit the Democracy MVP website listed above.
