

Member Highlight: James A. Cupper

This month, we're proud to spotlight one of our Staff Parish Relations Committee member, Jim Cupper, who will be recognized as a distinguished alumni by Western Michigan University this fall. In honor of this accolade, we felt it fitting to also celebrate his invaluable contributions to our church, from driving the church bus to helping out around the church and being an important part of our community.

Jim Cupper was born and raised in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. His family moved to Connecticut in 1960, where he attended Ridgefield High School. After graduation, Jim joined the U.S. Air Force, where he served four years as an air traffic controller. He was stationed at Hurlburt Air Force Base in Florida and later, at King Salmon Air Force Station in Alaska.



After an honorable discharge from the USAF, Jim studied advertising at Western Michigan University. He then worked for Burroughs Corporation, the FAA, and several advertising agencies, ultimately becoming a senior brand strategist for McCrosky Marketing Communications.

After retiring, Cupper led Habitat For Humanity's ReStore® "deconstruction" team, repurposing items from homes for resale. He tutors second-graders in Kalamazoo and has served on various boards. He began with the Gull Lake Area Rotary Club in the 1980s and rejoined the Kalamazoo Rotary in 2009. By 2015, he was its president, launching initiatives like Career Connections and the Christmas Adopt-A-Family program as well as hosting the club's centennial Gala and raising significant funds for Polio Plus.

Being a Methodist is deeply rooted in service, compassion, and living out one's faith actively in the world. It's about creating meaningful connections with others and making a positive difference in the community. Jim Cupper, alongside many at Kalamazoo FUMC, stands as a shining example, truly capturing the heart and spirit of what it means to be a Methodist. Through their actions and commitment, they illuminate the core principles that define Methodism.

August Mission of the Month

The August Mission-of-the-Month will benefit our own Helping Our Neighbors ministry (HON). This offering is limited to three types of support: we seek your prayers, your time, and/or your donations. Individuals facing eviction procedures or threats of a Consumers Energy shut-off require assistance to prevent dire outcomes. They reach out to the church either by referral from social workers or through the emergency information hotline, 211, at 269-243-2500. These calls result in a voicemail, and one of our volunteers typically responds within 24 hours. Rapid response is crucial. After a brief conversation, we usually determine whether we can assist them. Additionally, we guide our callers towards other agencies that can help. Typically, HON pledges \$100 to these individuals. Once they have raised the necessary funds to prevent shut-off or eviction, we forward our check to the landlord or Consumers Energy.

The funds HON distributes come from donations . It's not uncommon for us to give over \$750 a week. Collaborating with other agencies, we've even managed to raise as much as \$2500 for someone facing eviction or \$1000 for those at risk of power loss. Please support this initiative. In your prayers, consider if you might play the role of an angel for individuals confronting life-altering challenges. The people we assist are generally self-sufficient, with most having not sought our help since 2019.

Please know, the gift with the most profound impact would be your service as a volunteer. Thanks to your consistent generosity, we have yet to exhaust our funds.

Volunteers Wanted for Church Landscaping

Our crew of landscaping volunteers has grown very slim and all are at an age where they must retire. Jim Willoughby has led this small group for the past 11 years, and is ready to pass the baton to those who have the strength and desire to help keep up the various plantings around the parking lot and the church building. Second Floor Team

Early in 2023 the Trustees requested of the Church Council to create a team that could provide a recommendation regarding ideas for the use of the second floor following the closing of First Care. Church Council provided input and blessings and the Trustees ultimately had the determination about building use and the decision regarding how to reconfigure the space and how it will be utilized.

The team considered answering the following 2 questions.

Essential Question Number 1 for the second-floor team: Would the church want to consider partnering with an outside organization to use and occupy the east side of the second-floor space after the reconfiguration of the west side for church use?

- Those in attendance answered "yes."
- Reasons for answering yes are that there is a desire to use our church building more fully.

Essential Question Number 2 for the 2nd floor team: If so, what kind of use would we want the church to have for the East side space? There are implications to be considered if the organization were non-profit or for profit.

- Those in attendance answered, "children, or something for children, like a day care, preschool, or after school care."
- There is a need for more childcare for families in Kalamazoo, as there are so many on waiting lists. The second floor is set up for children, including the plumbing. We have several tiny potties for very little children and short sinks.
- Those in attendance decided nonprofit is best and began a list of non-profit childcare and preschools in the area and Julia Librizzi, Director of Children and Families Ministries, began to contact these potential partners.

Children and Families Ministries and the Trustees worked out a plan to reconfigure the second-floor space and consolidate their ministries to the West side of the second floor, around a special place we call "The Arches," and have the East side of the second floor be available for the potential partner.

As potential partners became interested Julia Librizzi (Director of Children and Famlies ministry), Chris Bovid (Chair of the Trustees) and Lori Owen-Rogers (Co-Leader of Church Council) helped give tours. Chris Bovid (Chair of the Trustees) then talked further with potential partners as they became more serious about partnering with us. We hope to have a potential partner soon and look forward to sharing the good news with you soon!
