Youth and Young Adult Ministry Update

Manna, First United Methodist Church young adult program, celebrated fall with gusto this year. In October, we took a trip to Gull Meadow Farms to pick apples. Most of us had never seen so many varieties. We filled our bags with a little of each type and conducted highly scientific research to prove which was the tastiest. After an afternoon of sampling all the farms had to offer, our decision was unanimous. Donuts won by a mile. Later in the fall, Manna had a Pumpkin Carving Jamboree with special guests Ngoy and Umba Kalangwa, who visited Kalamazoo from Tanzania, where they work for the United Methodist Church. Manna has also begun to engage in contemplative prayer. I am excited to see where this journey will take us. In early November, the youth group took a retreat to Wesley Woods. We played glow-in-the-dark capture the flag, where the youth taped glow sticks to one another's backs (for safety) and ran through the field searching for LED flags. The game proved to be a group favorite. In all seriousness, many youth cited the retreat as a much-needed space for rest and friendship in the midst of a hectic semester. I have seen the youth deepen their friendships and connection to their spirit over these months.

In November we asked the youth to write a list of the people who cared about them and the places they felt safe. The youth took this activity seriously. For several minutes, the only sound in the room was of markers on paper and the gentle noise of thinking. Several youth asked me for instructions like, should I write my name on this? And can I staple mine out of order? I told them to do what they wanted, there was no grade, and the writing was for them to look at when they needed reassurance of the good in their life. I know that for many of the youth, our church is one of their safe spaces. Thank you for being part of the community that cares for them.

It brings me deep joy that this church supports a program where young people can engage in thoughtful and meaningful conversation, listen to one another through challenges, and express themselves as they truly are. Thank you FUMC for your ongoing passion for these ministries. Blessings,

Celebrating 2 Years and 2,000 Books

Do you remember your first books? For many local children, new, engaging books are not part of their early development. Understanding that early exposure to books and reading to children from birth are critical steps to becoming a reader, the Outreach Team approved the distribution of books in the food pantry in 2013.

That distribution came to an end during the pandemic but in November of 2021, we were chosen to be the site of a Little Free Library. Just two years later, we celebrate with you that just under 2,000 books have moved from that library into the hands of children in our community.

If you have ever taken a peek inside the library, you may have noticed that we try to provide holiday and seasonal selections and especially during the summer, we add books for junior and senior high readers.

If you would like to contribute books, keep in mind that the books you give may be the only books a child receives! Our goal is to provide diverse, engaging, new or very gently used books so please no books with torn pages, writing in them, or chewed on board books. If you wish to donate, leave the books at the security desk in a bag marked "Little Free Library".
